UNIVERSITY GRADUATE SCHOLARS AWARD 2016-2017 NOMINATION FORM

Departments and programs are invited to submit names and dossiers of their nominees to the Office of Graduate and Professional Education where a faculty review committee determines the selection of scholars. Nominations are open to both newly admitted students and graduate students currently enrolled who are U.S. citizens or permanent resident immigrants. Awards are competitive and are based on many criteria including evidence of academic merit and academic achievement; cultural status (Black Americans, Hispanics, American Indians, American Asians, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, and other Pacific Islanders); physical disabilities; and/or need as determined by federal income guidelines (FAFSA). The University Graduate Scholars award may be administered either as a graduate fellowship or as a graduate assistantship. Awards are granted for one year. Students may be nominated for the award in subsequent years but may receive a maximum of two years of funding in this program.

Nominations are open to and due by **February 2, 2016** for early decision for new students entering a graduate program in Fall 2016. The nominations for students being nominated for the second year of the award must be received by this same deadline.

Nominations are accepted to March 2, 2016 for new students entering a graduate program in Fall 2016.
